## What should I already know how to do?

- Explore working with paint on different surfaces and in different ways i.e., hand and finger painting, painting on stones, 2D and 3D surfaces.
- Explore working on different levels - floor, easel, and table.
- Look and talk about what they have produced, describing simple techniques and media used.

| Portrait | A portrait is a painting, photograph, sculpture, or other artistic <br> representation of a person, in which the face and its expressions are <br> known. |
| Angles | The difference in direction of two lines which meet or tend to meet. |
| Primary <br> colours | Primary colours are basic colours that can be mixed together to produce <br> other colours. They are usually considered to be red, yellow, blue, and <br> sometimes green. |
| Secondar <br> y colours | A colour resulting from the mixing of two primary colours. |
| Tools | A device or implement, especially one held in the hand, used to carry out <br> a particular function. |
| Global | Relating to the whole world; worldwide. |
| Pattern | A repeated decorative design. |
| Texture | The feel, appearance, or consistency of a surface or substance. |
