## Key Vocabulary

| Word | Definition |
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| Tints | A tint is where an artist adds a colour to white to create a <br> lighter version of the colour. |
| Shades | A shade is where an artist adds black to a colour to darken <br> it down. A tone is where an artist adds grey to a colour. |
| Theme | Theme relates to the meaning of a painting, rather than <br> the subject, which is specific and basic. |
| Background <br> wash | A watercolour wash refers to a layer of colour that is <br> somewhat transparent applied with diluted paint. Typically, <br> washes are applied over a large area of a painting to help <br> create backgrounds or build layers of colour. |
| Abstract <br> art | Abstract art uses visual language of shape, form, colour <br> and line to create a composition which may exist with a <br> degree of independence from visual references in the <br> world. |
