Tints	A tint is where an artist adds a colour to white to create a lighter version of the colour.
Shades	A shade is where an artist adds black to a colour to darken it down. A tone is where an artist adds grey to a colour.
Theme	Theme relates to the meaning of a painting, rather than the subject, which is specific and basic.
Background wash	A watercolour wash refers to a layer of colour that is somewhat transparent applied with diluted paint. Typically, washes are applied over a large area of a painting to help create backgrounds or build layers of colour.
Abstract art	Abstract art uses visual language of shape, form, colour and line to create a composition which may exist with a degree of independence from visual references in the
