

## Yr 3 Knowledge Organiser – Investigating Our Local Area **Cheshunt Including Chiltern**

In Geography year 3, students will learn about their Local town Cheshunt and the nearby area of Chiltern area in the UK. They will locate the countries that make up the UK on a map, name the capital cities, and label key cities. Students will also name the seas surrounding the UK and identify main rivers. They will explain what a county is, find their county on a map, and locate areas of higher ground. Students will name some areas of higher ground in the UK and learn about the history of London, including who first settled there and how it has changed since AD 43. They will find London on world and UK maps and describe how the UK population has changed over time. Finally, students will identify the local area of Cheshunt and compare it with the nearby area of Chiltern, considering both manmade and natural features.


### **Unit overview**

In this unit, children will take a look at the geography of the UK - from the physical features of mountains, rivers and seas to the man-made administrative regions and counties. They will find out how the UK has changed over time, looking at how London grew and how the population of the UK as a whole has changed throughout the course of history.
