



Remote Learning 2020/21 Action Plan. – now update for January 2021

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

This meets the expectations set out in the DfE guidance 'Remote Education Support'

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (eg.laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

You will find here an overview of lessons to be completed each day. If you click on your CLASS you will see specifically the curriculum expectations set by your class teacher.

It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

The daily timetable will include:

- Maths – Oak National Academy / White Rose Maths and Mathletics (including times tables)
- Reading – Using the Oxford Owl / Bug club on line scheme
- Writing – Using the National Academy
- Spelling/Phonics – using Phonics play and the you tube channel
- Two foundation subject- learning linked to the year group curriculum – Using the Oak National Academy.

Additional support for pupils with particular needs

How will you work with me to help my child who needs additional support from adults at home to access remote education?

We recognise that some pupils, for example some pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), may not be able to access remote education without support from adults at home. We acknowledge the difficulties this may place on families, and we will work with parents and carers to support those pupils in the following ways:

- Millbrook Primary School will work with families to deliver remote education for pupils with SEND. This will include staff delivering interventions to SEND pupils via live zoom sessions for 3 times a week. This provision will allow children with SEND needs to continue to work on their Individual Education Plans remotely.*
- Resources will be made available to SEND pupils as a priority group for parents to use with their children at home.*
- Staff will scaffold the weekly work set remotely for children with SEND.*
- We will work with families to deliver remote education for younger pupils.*
- Places at school will always be open to children with an EHCP.*

Remote education for self-isolating pupils

Where individual pupils need to self-isolate but the majority of their peer group remains in school, the remote education that is provided is not likely to differ from the approach for whole class groups.

There will be additional phone calls from the Learning Mentor to offer extra support to both child and family. Through this, any further support will be identified and arranged.

As from February 22nd 2021, additional pre-recorded lessons will be used to further support learning at home.

The Oak National Academy.

The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device- pupils only need materials they can find at home.

Providing feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers via the school office admin email admin@millbrook.herts.sch.uk or their class email. Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

Contact with pupils/ parents

Parents are able to contact the school via telephone or the school admin email address. Teachers will email back feedback if required, BCC copying the Headteacher into any correspondence. Any response should be made within 48 hours. Where a pupil is self-isolating on medical ground for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed.

Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted by the Learning Mentor on a weekly basis and support offered as necessary.

Data protection

When accessing personal data, all staff members will: Only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their school laptop only.

Sharing personal data

Staff members are unlikely to need to collect and/or share personal data. However, if it does become necessary, staff are reminded to collect and/or share as little personal data as possible online. All data collection will be compliant with GDPR guidelines.

Keeping devices secure

All staff will take appropriate steps to ensure their devices remain secure. Computers should be locked if left inactive for a period of time. Operating systems must be up to date – always install the latest updates.

Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed by the SLT as and when updates to home learning are provided by the government. At present the only 'live lessons' will be used via the Oak Academy.
